Campers are required to wear hard-soled shoes with a heel and long pants; they may change into shorts after the riding lesson. Helmets will be provided, or campers may bring their own SEI/ASTM approved helmet. Gloves are optional.

Each camper should bring a lunch and snack, and plenty of liquids. Food and drinks may be kept cold in the camp refrigerator. A water cooler is provided.

There are four 2007 sessions:

- I. June 18-22      II. June 25-29
- III. July 9-13      IV. July 16-20

It is recommended that campers wishing to participate in two sessions attend either I and II or III and IV. This will provide least amount of overlap of the subject matter.

Cost for the week is \$245.00. **Space is limited** to 8 campers per week. To secure reservations, a non-refundable deposit of \$50 must accompany this form. Registration by May 1<sup>st</sup> receives a 10% discount.
